### Sir James Galway Flute Masterclass

Lights, camera, action! That's what TFS had at the Meyerson Symphony Center in Dallas on Saturday, February 24. The lights were turned on by the Dallas Symphony Orchestra, co-presenter of the event. The camera was manned by Mark Richter. And, the action came from Sir James Galway, 3 excellent performers and their accompanists. Galway taught us, cajoled and told stories to our very attentive "flute" audience.

Sir James reminded us about our embouchures, vibrato, posture, how to focus and project the sound, how to grip the flute (no clanking fingers), and to choose a good flute and/or headjoint.

He startled Diondre when he offered his own new flute for Diondre to try. Diondre was equal to the task. Yes, he sounded better, and played the Nielsen with passion.

Shauna benefited from Sir James' discussion of breathing and encouraged us to fill our rib cage and chest with more air. Sir James put his headjoint on her flute to give it a try. Then, she gave Liebermann her very best interpretation.

Sir James' demonstration of short, separated notes and his continuous little short breaths let him play for a long time without an apparent "breath." We loved it!

Mark attacked the Bartok fearlessly. Sir James asked Mark to play with more intensity and he did it on the spot.

In all, Sir James encouraged the young flutists, amazed the parents and reinforced flute techniques for the teachers. A great day for all!

#### 30th Anniversary!

The 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary for the Texas Flute Festival is pretty special. I remember some of those first Festivals.

Claire Johnson was very helpful 'cause she was teaching flute at SMU and could provide the venue for the Festival (you know, recital hall, rooms for soloists and ensembles). It was Claire's vision and tenacity that helped get the Festival going and kept it going. Others who helped were Myrna Brown, Judy Pierce, Dr. George Morey, Joe Tallal and Morty Rapfogle. I'll quote from the TFS History:

"Under the leadership of our third president, Myrna Brown, plans began to be made for our first flute festival. A Texas Flute Club newsletter described the guiding philosophy for the first festival:

"... this is planned to be a festival of the highest caliber where our own fine area flutists can perform and be heard and for all flutists to share in their experience. The purpose behind the festival is to provide a place of performance to flutists and a listening experience for all others. Emphasis is on excellence of performance with helpful criticism being made by the judges."

The first flute festival was held during our fourth year. On November 12 and 13, 1977, approximately 100 flutists gathered at Southern Methodist University in Dallas. Our early festivals were directed toward a specific stylistic period, and the first festival focused on the Baroque period. Albert Tipton was the guest artist for the first festival. The success of the first flute festival led to a second in April of 1979."

Our purpose for the Festival has not changed. Pretty amazing! Flutists play for helpful critique, not ratings.

Our guest artists come from everywhere and are top notch performers, educators and proponents of all that is "flute."

The Festival is open to the public and provides many hours of "listening" to fine flute music.

Now its outgrowth, EURHYTHMIONICS, has ended up as a better crafted and more mature piece of music that I feel is finally worthy of taking its place alongside the growing concert repertoire for the piccolo.

EURHYTHMIONICS is a hybrid of eurhythmy\*, Europe (where many of my most influential composers/heroes came from), rhythm, and phonics.

\*Eurhythmy: rhythmical movement; a system of harmonious body movement to the rhythm of spoken words

# Largo for Alto Flute\* and Piano Ludwig van Beethoven

Flutists universally recognize Theobald Boehm (1784-1881) as the creator of the modern concert flute in C, but his favorite flute was actually the modern alto flute in G, which he created in 1850.
