What is a Masterclass?

The word "masterclass" is a noun defined in the *Merriam-Webster Dictionary* as "a seminar for advanced music students conducted by a master musician." As an attendee at the upcoming 2011 TFS Flute Festival, there will be several opportunities to attend a masterclass. Performers for the masterclasses at the Festival were chosen through recorded audition. Please refer to the Festival Schedule on page three for detailed information regarding, who, what, where, and when.

A masterclass consists of several students/performers, a master musician, an audience, and often times an



accompanist. Each performer is given an allotted amount of time to work with the master musician. During that time, the performer will perform a selection, often times a movement from a larger work. Some master musicians allow a full performance, followed by instruction. Others prefer to stop the performer as soon as something is heard that needs attention. Generally the master musician will identify several specific items for the performer to focus on and improve during the masterclass. These items may include technique, tone, phrasing, articulation, breathing, musicianship, interpretation, body language, and rhythm.

As an audience member, how can you participate? If you know the repertoire ahead of the masterclass, bring your own personal copy of the music. Also bring a notebook and writing utensil to take notes of

what is said by the master musician. Besides working one-on-one with the performer, frequently the master musician will also include audience participation, such as with breathing exercises and sometimes tone production. So be sure to also have your flute handy.

A masterclass is a valuable opportunity to gain new knowledge and insight, both for the performer and audience member. I highly encourage you to attend as many of the masterclasses offered at the Festival as possible. Every masterclass will be unique as no two performers or master musicians are alike. Grab your notebook, pencil, music, flute, and get ready to learn!

Masterclasses will be given by guest artists **Linda Toote**, principal flutist of the Boston Lyric Opera and faculty member at Boston University College of Fine Arts and the Boston Conservatory; **Jonathan Keeble**, flute professor at the University of Illinois at Urbana Champaign, principal flute of the Sinfonia da Camera, and recording artist; **Jill Felber**, member of the flute duo ZAWA! and flute professor at the University of California, Santa Barbara; and **Seth Allyn Morris**, the winner of the 2010 Myrna W. Brown Competition.





TFS Festival Parking

UNT has implemented a paid parking program that requires each vehicle to have a \$4 permit during business hours. That means if you will be parking a vehicle at UNT on Wednesday, Thursday or Friday between 9:00 am and 5:00 pm, you will need a different parking tag for each of these days.
