

## Texas Flute Festival May 14-16, 2015

The Texas Flute Society proudly announces its **38<sup>th</sup> Annual Texas Flute Festival**, Thursday, May 14, through Saturday, May 16, 2015, on the campus of Texas Woman's University, Denton, TX. This year's guest artists, **Bonita Boyd** (Artist-Performer and Professor of flute at Eastman School of Music), **Flutronix** (Artist-Performers, producers, and composers), and **Kristyn Son** (winner of the 2014 Myrna Brown Competition) will present numerous recitals, seminars, and masterclasses throughout Friday and Saturday. Flutists (junior high school level and above) who are interested in performing in the masterclasses presented by the Guest Artists must apply. The prestigious **30**<sup>th</sup> **Annual Myrna W. Brown Artist Competition** will hold its semi-final round at the Festival on Thursday, May 14<sup>th</sup>, while the final round will occur on Friday, May 15<sup>th</sup>. The final round of the **4**<sup>th</sup> **Annual Donna Marie Haire Young Artist Competition** for middle and high school flutists is scheduled to take place on Saturday, May 16<sup>th</sup>. The exhibit hall will also be open all day Saturday with exhibitors from across the country displaying flutes, music, accessories, and much more! For more information about the Myrna W. The Texas Flute Festival also provides an opportunity for flutists of all levels and ages to perform a solo and/or ensemble for a recognized flute specialist on Friday, May 15<sup>th</sup>, and the final day of the Festival, Saturday, May 16<sup>th</sup>. Constructive commentary will be given for each performance, and performers are welcome to record both their performances and comments if they bring their own recording devices. Participants will also receive a hard copy of clinician feedback and comments. The Festival is not a contest, and no rankings are given. However, Outstanding and Honor Performers are recognized at each level. Outstanding/Honor performers receive a certificate, and their names will be posted on the TFS website. Outstanding Solo performers also receive a one-year membership to the Texas Flute Society.

Flutists may also participate in the **Festival Flute Choirs**. Participation in the Festival Flute Choirs is included in the Performer and Auditor Festival Fees, so there is no additional charge. Flutists may come and go as their schedule permits. Music will be distributed at the rehearsal.

Whether you are coming to the Festival to hear our guest artists, perform yourself, play in the flute choirs, or visit the exhibits, we look forward to seeing you at Texas Woman's University in May! 

### **Guest Artists**



**Bonita Boyd** is professor of flute at the Eastman School of Music and an active concert soloist throughout the world. She is currently an artist-faculty member of the Aspen Music Festival and co-principal flutist of the Aspen Festival Orchestra. She has been president of the National Flute Association, a 5,000-member worldwide organization of flutists. Ms. Boyd's premieres and recordings of new works include those of Adler, Benson, Rozsa, Rands, Augusta Read Thomas, Sessler, Sierra, and most recently, the National Flute Association's first performance of Melinda Wagner's Pulitzer Prize-winning Flute Concerto. Her Flute Music of Les Six won a Stereo Review Record of the Year award, and her Paganini Caprice CD was on the final Ballot for a Grammy. Bonita has been awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award by the National Flute Association, as well as the Eisenhart Award for Excellence in Teaching by the Eastman School.

**Flutronix** is Nathalie Joachim and Allison Loggins-Hull. Their work as performers, producers, and composers has moved them to collaborate with artists and ensembles from different realms and disciplines. Flutronix has been featured in an internationally broadcast ESPN super bowl commercial, as well as television segments on Telemundo and The Daily Buzz. The duo is regularly sought after as clinicians and educators and has presented and lectured for The Juilliard School, New England Conservatory, the University of Michigan, the New York Flute Club, the Atlanta Flute Club and other institutions across the country. Their latest album, "2.0" has been recently released on the duo's label as well as by Village Again Records in Japan. Flutronix is proud to be Burkart flute artists.





**Kristyn Son** was the First Prize winner of the 2014 Myrna W. Brown Artist Competition. Kristyn pursues a diverse musical career as a much sought after soloist, chamber musician, and teacher. She is currently pursuing the Doctorate of Musical Arts at University of North Texas under the guidance of Dr. Mary Karen Clardy. Kristyn is a top prize and awards winner of numerous American competitions, and has also been awarded several First Prizes in Korea. She presented a successful debut recital at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie in March, 2013. Ms. Son received a Bachelor of Music from the Peabody Conservatory, and a Master of Music from the Manhattan School of Music. Her principal teachers include Anne Diener Zentner, Marina Piccinini, Marya Martin, Bradley Garner, Elizabeth McNutt, and Mary Karen Clardy.



Dear Flute Teachers,

Are you interested in having your students perform a solo and/or ensemble for a clinician at the **Texas Flute Festival**? To facilitate the process of registration and scheduling, it is preferred that you collect all of the information from students planning to perform along with their registration fees and submit them to the Texas Flute Society as one comprehensive application and payment. A letter to parents explaining the Festival and its procedures is provided on the following page for you to distribute. An application is also included. Entries must be postmarked or submitted online by April 1, 2015. To register online, go to www.texasflutesociety.org and click on the online registration link beginning March 1<sup>st</sup>. Create your own user ID and password in order to add, save, or edit entries to your registration. Fees incurred will automatically load on a separate page. You will simply print out the fees page and send it with your check to the address provided. Please see below for more information and regulations:

#### FLUTE FESTIVAL INFORMATION & PROCEDURES

- Undergraduate, graduate, and adult performers must be 2015 members of the Texas Flute Society. Elementary, Jr. High, and High School students must either be members or have a teacher who is a member of TFS. Please encourage your students to join TFS so they receive newsletters & announcements.
- Accompanists are required for selections with accompaniment. Please ensure that your accompanists are playing for no more than 25 solos/ensembles per day and include the accompanist's full name on the application.
- Performers must provide a legible copy of the music with numbered measures to the flute specialist upon arrival at their assigned performance time.
- Each performance may be recorded along with the specialist's comments. If interested, performers must provide their own recording devices.
- This is not a competition. Clinicians will provide feedback on a comment sheet.
- Outstanding/Honor performers in each category will be posted on the TFS website following the Festival. Outstanding soloists will receive a one-year membership for the Texas Flute Society. Certificates for Outstanding and Honor performers will be mailed to the teacher for distribution.
- Performers may also participate in the **Festival Flute Choirs**. The Flute Choirs are open to any registered flutist or auditor at no additional charge. Performers may come and go as their schedule permits. Music will be distributed at the rehearsal.
- This is an all day festival. We encourage students and their parents to spend the day attending masterclasses, workshops, flute choirs, concerts, and exhibits. Parents may attend free of charge. It is not every day that students get to hear flutists at the caliber of our guest artists. The Festival provides an incredible and inspirational experience for flutists of all levels.
- Fees: Solo entries \$12.00; Ensemble entries \$5.00 per member. Ensembles with more than 30 members will pay a flat \$150 fee. Auditors and Flute Choir Only participants \$12.00. Student fees will be collected by the teacher. Make a single check for all fees, t-shirts, patches, and memberships. Cash is not accepted.
- Teachers interested in attending the Festival must also register and pay the appropriate fee.
- DEADLINE: Entries must be postmarked or submitted online by April 1, 2015. No telephone entries will be accepted.
- No changes to the schedule will be made after April 25, 2015. No exceptions are possible!

#### **Dear Flute Parents:**

The **38<sup>th</sup> Annual Texas Flute Festival**, sponsored by the Texas Flute Society, will be held Thursday, May 14, through Saturday, May 16, 2015, at Texas Woman's University - Denton. We are inviting all students to perform a solo and/or participate in an ensemble before a recognized flute specialist on Saturday, May 16th. The Festival is not a contest and no ratings are given. However, Outstanding and Honor performers are recognized. The performance and the comments of the clinician may be recorded if the student provides a recording device so that flute students can learn from their experience. Participants will also receive a hard copy of clinician feedback and comments. Parents may attend all the events of the festival with their child at no additional charge, however they must register at the check-in table to receive wristbands. Membership in TFS is not required but is suggested so that you can receive announcements about upcoming events and newsletters throughout the year. Participation in the Festival Flute Choirs is free of charge and open to any registered flutist or auditor without additional charge. Students may come and go as their schedules permit. ALL festival flute choirs will meet in MUS 317. Music will be distributed at the rehearsal.

These world-renowned flutists will give masterclasses, workshops, concerts, and presentations Friday evening and throughout the day on Saturday. Exhibitors will fill two spacious halls with flutes, flute merchandise, sheet music, and CDs for your shopping pleasure all day Saturday. Students and parents are encouraged to take advantage of this all day enrichment opportunity by attending concerts, masterclasses, and workshops which are appropriate for all levels. It is not every day that students get to hear flutists at the caliber of these guest artists. The Festival provides an incredible and inspirational experience for flutists of all levels. Attendance at events presented by the Guests Artists is also included in the performer entry fee, so no additional fee is needed. 




**Directions from Dallas:** Proceed to Denton. Take exit 464, which becomes Dallas Drive. Stay on Dallas Drive, which passes under a railroad bridge and curves to the right, where it becomes Bell Ave. Continue on Bell Avenue. After crossing McKinney Street, Bell Avenue will curve to the left (you must be in the left lane to make the turn). Ahead of you will be the TWU campus with its distinctive high-rise buildings. At the intersection of Bell Avenue and Administration Drive, turn left. Follow the TFS signs to parking.

**Directions from Ft. Worth:** Take Interstate 35W to Denton, exiting at University Drive (US 380). Turn right on University Drive. Follow University Drive to Bell Avenue, which runs through the TWU campus. Turn right on Bell Avenue. Turn right on Administration Drive and follow TFS signs to parking.
